

OHIO HIGH SCHOOL BASKETBALL COACHES ASSOCIATION
March 22, 2006 – 12:30 PM at Holiday Inn on the Lane, Columbus OH

1. Welcome by President **Joe Balogh**.
2. **Tom Rettig**, District 9, led us in prayer.
3. The following guests were present: Mike Meyers, Joe LaBella
4. **Bob Von Kaenel** read roll call. Absent – Tom Woodford (GAC)
5. **FALL MEETING MINUTES - 1st Walsh - 2nd Gorski** to approve the minutes of the fall meeting after amending the replaced coaches for the Girls North/South All-Star Game. John Jones(Mariemont) and Chris Besecker(Covington) replaced the South D-III/IV Coaches. Motion Carried.
6. **TREASURER’S REPORT - 1st Rettig – 2nd Nossaman** to approve the Treasurer’s Report. Motion Carried. Wayne reported that we had received monies from Rawlings. Thank you to Jerry Williams – Rawlings Representative.
7. Membership Report. **Wayne Wiseman** reported membership at 3,739 members. This is slightly lower than last year.

Dr. Dan Ross, OHSAA Commissioner discussed points from an executive meeting. These were: 1) Officials Voting procedures – suggestions were made to make the process more clear. Dr. Ross stated that there are changes being made now and the system will be re-done 2) There will be no fine for failure to vote this year 3) Discipline action plan – This is for coaches/officials conflicts and a process is being put in place for sequential steps that will be taken when disciplinary action is needed for officials or coaches 4) Currently all 6 district boards are working on a seeding process that will be similar statewide. Dr. Ross did ask us for input in this area 5) He discussed Non-Boundary schools, and equitable options for the future 6) He also said additional games for charitable contributions may be considered. 7) **BLUE RIBBON COMMITTEES**: Dr. Ross stated that there are FIVE areas they are looking at: Non-Boundary Schools, By-Laws, Media/Technology (creating more templates), Interscholastic Sports 20/20 (where are we headed?), and Length of seasons (elimination of dead periods)

8. OIAAA – Dave Bell (Zanesville) – Discussed the 22-game proposal and the feelings their group has towards this issue. He stated that we should mention that basketball needs to be on an equitable playing field and that he supported the 22-game proposal

District 2: Sean O’Toole (Euclid) – 1) Go back to the old FT rule 2) Concerned about officials worrying more about sideline control than officiating games 3) Some coaches would like all private schools to play in Division I 4) Concerned about Regional Playing Sites; one team drove 2 hours to play a team who was 10 minutes away, and had played 7 games on the tournament floor prior to this game 5) Concerned about “Club Coaches” having more contact time with our players than coaches do

District 3: Bob Walsh (Elyria) –1) Concern over the selection procedure for tournament games for officials; would like this to be explained in detail 2) Uniform Seeding for entire state. 3) Opposed to divided Regional Tournament Sites 4) Favor 22-game proposal

District 4: Joe Bogdan (East Canton) –1) Concerns about voting for officials procedure done on line 2) Continue to pursue 22-games 3) Concerned about coaching box being eliminated by the OHSAA Board of Control

District 5: Joe Dunlevy (Indian Creek) –1) 76% of girl's coaches favored St. John Arena as the Girls State Tournament Venue (provided the floor is properly marked)

District 6: Greg Nossaman (Willard) –1) Would like to see the number of quarters played per season increased.

District 7: Ken Burgei (Wauseon) –1) Girl's State Tournament – 22 Schools – St. John Arena 29 Schools - Schott

District 8: Jeff Heistan (Shawnee) –1) Inconsistency/situation of coaches box 2) Problems with New Officials Rating System: a. not being able to get into the system b. officials being able to go to the system and check what coaches are saying personally 3) prefer Schott as the Girls State Tourney Site
