Berlin Hiland girls' basketball coach Dave Schlabach won his 500<sup>th</sup> game January 26<sup>th</sup> bringing his career record to 500 wins and just 82 losses. Schlabach's Lady Hawks have won 4 state titles and have played in the state final-four on 7 other occasions in his 23 seasons on the bench. ## Changes Made to Northeast Ohio's Tournament Format

This year, Northeast Ohio basketball coaches and fans will welcome a new rule change to the Sectional Tournament format, the higher seeded team will host home games through the Sectional. Also, in Division I the Northeast District Athletic Board decided to have “blended” districts because there are so many schools within close proximity. Bill Schumacher, President of the Northeast Board, believes that the change is for the better. He stated, “It’s truly for the student-athletes, not about money. Plus, most district locations weren’t able to host the tournament for the full two weeks. Change will be difficult at first, but it’s for the better.” He was asked to make the change for all divisions but geographically, Division III and IV would be extremely difficult because of the travel. But, Schumacher said the Board wants feedback from the coaches. Schumacher said that the big transition when he first started was, “The transition from a two man to a three man officiating crew followed by seeding all teams in the district versus the pill format. Each change has brought ideas from coaches on how to make them better and the Northeast Board is always receptive to those suggestions.”
