CONSTUTION OF THE OHIO HIGH SCHOOL BASKETBALL COACHES ASSOCIATION

Article I

Name

The name of this organization shall be "The Ohio High School Basketball Coaches Association" and is a voluntary organization for non-profit.

Article II Objectives

- A. To promote harmonious relationship between principals and coaches in their respective schools concerning the administration of the game of basketball.
- B. To promote pure, wholesome, amateur interscholastic basketball in the schools of Ohio.
- C. To help maintain the highest possible standards in interscholastic basketball and the basketball coaching profession, and to work together for the improvement of conditions in Ohio High School Basketball.
- D. To secure a better understanding of the problems of high school basketball coaches and to place at the disposal of coaches, sources of information.
- E. To have a representative group of coaches to which may be referred basketball problems of general interest in the hope of creating better relationships between high schools and a sympathetic understanding of all basketball problems.
- F. To promote good fellowship and social contacts among coaches.
- G. To honor and recognize players and coaches for their achievements and accomplishments in Ohio Basketball.
- H. To honor and recognize other people outside the organization who promote Ohio Basketball.

Article III

District Membership

- Sect. 1 The State of Ohio shall be divided into sixteen Districts in the Association.
- Sect. 2 The state will be divided into two divisions, North and South.
- Sect. 3 The North division will be comprised of Districts 1-8, and the South division will be comprised of Districts 9-16
- Sect. 4 The procedure to be followed when a school wishes to transfer from one district to another:
 - A. The Directors of the two districts involved shall make recommendations to the District Directors.
 - B. The District Directors of the OHSBCA by majority vote must approve of the transfer.

Article IV

Coaches Membership

- Sect. 1 The membership in this association will be comprised of active and college coaches.
 - A. Active memberships are those members who are currently coaching an interscholastic team or those individuals who want to be involved in the Association.

- B. College coach membership are those members who are coaching at the collegiate level and want to establish a working relationship with the Association. This membership entitles them to receive issues of the *Hooplines* magazine.
- Sect. 2 The memberships shall extend from October 1 to September 30 of the next year.
- Sect. 3 No one shall join the Association after December 31 and before the membership begins for the next fiscal year.
- Sect. 4 Forgiveness Rule
 - A. After being a member for 5 consecutive years you are eligible for this rule.
 - B. It can be used only one time in your coaching career.
 - C. If a member has realized after January 1st that they did not join the OHSBCA, they can apply for this one time exemption.
 - D. The member must still join the association and also return an Exemption Form with an additional \$10 processing fee.
 - E. The Member or School/Team will not be eligible for any annual awards of that season (POY, COY, Scoring, Etc.)
 - F. The Member will not have years of Membership broken, and still remain eligible for career awards (Paul Walker, Scholarship, Arnzen, etc.)
 - G. Once a member has received this one time exemption it can NEVER be used again.
- Sect. 5 An active membership in the OHSBCA is necessary to receive the following benefits:
 - A. Coaching Awards and Honors.
 - B. Players Awards and Honors
 - C. Voting privileges for annual elections
 - 1. Voting members are coaches who submit their membership application prior to the voting deadline.
 - 2. Regular members are coaches who submit their membership application prior to the December 31st deadline.
 - D. Receive issues of the Hooplines magazine.
 - E. Sons and daughters are eligible for scholarships.
 - F. Vote for the North-South representative in your district.

Article V

Dues

Sect. 1 The annual membership fee shall be set by two-thirds vote of the District Directors.

Article VI

Cancellation of Membership

Sect. 1 Membership in the Association shall be suspended each fiscal year. Suspension shall be lifted with the payment of annual dues. The fiscal year of the Association shall be from October 1 to September 30 inclusive.

- Sect. 2 The District Directors, by two-thirds vote, may suspend the membership of any member whom the directors deem to have violated the purposes of this constitution.
- Sect. 3 Any member whose membership has been canceled by a vote of the District Directors may appeal directly to the Association's District Directors for reinstatement.

Article VII

Election Procedures

- Sect. 1 The Officers, District Directors, and Girls District Directors are elected positions within the Association by the membership of the Association.
- Sect. 2 The officers on the Executive Committee shall serve a three-year term, then automatically progress to the next position in the Executive Committee.
- Sect. 3 The positions of Treasurer and Secretary shall be elected every four years.
- Sect. 4 Future elections will be held as follows:
 - A. Treasurer (4-year term) elections will occur in the years 2019, 2023 and 2027.
 - B. Secretary (4-year term) elections will occur in the years 2017, 2021 and 2025.
 - C. Vice President (9-year term) elections will occur in the years 2016, 2019, and 2022.
 - D. Odd Number District Directors (3-year term) elections will occur in the years 2016, 2019 and 2022.
 - E. Even Number District Directors (3-year term) elections will occur in the years 2017, 2020 and 2023.
 - F. Girls District Directors (3-year term) for Districts 1 & 4, 8 & 9, 10 & 11 and 13 & 14 elections will occur in the years 2016, 2019 and 2022.
 - G. Girls District Directors (3-year term) for Districts 2 & 3, 5 & 12, 6 & 7 and 15 & 16 elections will occur in the years 2017, 2020 and 2023.
- Sect. 5 Election procedure will consist of the following:
 - A. Notification of upcoming position, qualifications for the position, and the procedures to run for the position for the next election will be published in the Winter Edition of *Hooplines*.
 - B. Members will send a letter of intent to the President of the Association stating the position in which they will run for by July 1st.
 - C. The Executive Committee will establish a ballot and voting deadline at their Summer meeting.
 - D. Elections ballots and membership application will be available for the first week of September.
 - E. Voting will occur between 1st week of September to the established deadline in October.
 - F. Voting members ballots will be counted by the Treasurer on the established deadline.
- Sect. 6 Qualifications for the election:
 - A. Treasurer, Secretary, District Directors and Girls District Directors
 - 1. Must be a member of the Association.

B. Vice President

- 1. Must be a member of the Association
- Must have served at least one year as a member of the District Directors, Girls District Directors or must have been a Head Basketball Coach and a member of the Association for at least ten years.

Article VIII

Executive Committee

- Sect. 1 The Executive Committee shall consist of President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Secretary, Past President, and Executive Director and other members appointed by the President of the Association.
- Sect. 2 In case of the loss of an officer, for any reason, the District Directors shall fill said vacancy.
- Sect. 3 All Officers within the organizations will be paid position according to the fee schedule approved by the District Directors. Also, paid positions are Hooplines Editor/Historian/Public Relations Director, All-Star Game Directors, Hall of Fame Director, Clinic Director, Web Master, Showcase Directors, Awards Director and Executive Director.
- Sect. 4 The Vice-President will automatically become President and following that three-year term as President will serve as the Past President for three years.
- Sect. 5 The duties of the Officers will be assigned by the President of the Association. These duties will remain the same for the entire tenure of the Officers. These duties will include:
 - A. chairing standing committees
 - B. attending State Board Meetings
 - C. assisting the Treasurer with the elections returns
 - D. aiding in the solicitation of funds for advertisement
 - E. presenting recommendations to the OHSAA Board of Control in April
 - F. helping in the new director orientation
 - G. preparing agendas for meetings
 - H. sending correspondences from the Association, i.e. congratulatory letters
 - I. presenting scholarships at All-Star games
 - J. introducing the recipient of the Paul Walker Award
 - K. forming OHSBCA Standing Committees
 - L. assisting in the clinic
 - M. serving as Master of Ceremonies of Hall of Fame Induction Dinner
 - N. coordinating halftime activities at state tournament games
 - O. working with Boys and Girls North-South All-Star Game Directors
 - P. coordinating and initiating All-Star Game activities
 - Q. presenting Player of the Year Awards at All-Star Game
 - R. securing rooms when necessary
 - S. assisting in Constitutional Revision
 - T. directing membership drive
 - U. organizing entertainment and refreshments at meetings

- V. auditing the Treasurer's books annually
- W. working with the Showcase Directors
- Sect. 6 The duties of the Treasurer and Secretary will be assigned by the President of the Association. Some of these duties for these positions will include:

A. Treasurer

- 1. Communications
- 2. Attends OHSAA State Board of Control Meetings
- Responsible for elections and the counting of ballots
- 4. Dispensing of monies to pay bills and expenses
- 5. Responsible for overseeing the membership drive and providing membership list
- 6. Responsible for preparing and sending tax information to state and federal government

B. Secretary

- 1. Responsible for the recording of the minutes during meetings
- Will prepare minutes to be distributed to District Directors and Officers
- Will attend OHSAA State Board of Control Meetings
- 4. Provide communication to the officers, directors and other OHSBCA personnel (i.e. agendas)
- 5. Maintain and update all OHSBCA forms
- 6. Send out all correspondence dealing with the Association's membership (i.e. membership forms, clinic information, application for awards, etc.)
- Create and update an OHSBCA Directory for all Officers, District Directors, Girls Advisory Members and other OHSBCA Personnel

C. Executive Director

- 1. Secures corporate and individual sponsorship
- 2. Secures facilities (hotels, gymnasium, meeting places, clinic venue, state tournament) for OHSBCA events
- 3. Attends OHSAA State Board of Control Meetings and NHSBCA Meetings
- 4. Orders all merchandise for OHSBCA events
- 5. Maintains a monthly and year calendar for OHSBCA events
- 6. Recruits personnel for leadership positions
- 7. Establishes a relationship with all media for the purpose of advancing the association's exposure

Article IX

The Board of Directors

Sect. 1 Management of the affairs for the Association shall be vested in the sixteen (16) District Directors and eight (8) Girls District Directors, one from each district in the State, and the Executive Committee. A point of emphasis - Officers and Directors have the right to make motions but only the twenty-four District Directors have the right to vote on these motions. In the event of a tie, all officers may vote.

- Sect. 2 The election of the District Directors and alternates shall be made by mail prior to the fall meeting. A membership ballot will be mailed to all head coaches in the state. It will also be available in the membership issue of the *Hooplines* and on the OHSBCA webpage. These ballots must be received by the Treasurer by the Monday before the fall meeting.
- Sect. 3 If the elected Director is unable to serve for any part or all of his or her term, an alternate will be appointed in this position by the association with input from the district director for that portion of the term for which the elected director is unable to serve.
- Sect. 4 The Executive Committee and District Directors shall have complete control and management of the affairs, funds, and properties of the Association. On an annual basis, the Past President shall audit the books and make a report to the District Directors at the fall meeting.
- Sect. 5 The District Directors shall meet prior to the State Basketball Clinic, in the Fall one week after the election, on the day prior to the Boys State Tournament and any special date called by the President or the majority of the District Directors.
- Sect. 6 The term of office for the District Directors shall be three years each.
- Sect. 7 Expenses for the Officers, the District Directors, OHSBCA Event Directors, OHSBCA Support Personnel and invited guests of the Association to the meetings designated in Section 5 above and attendance at the OHSAA State Board of Control Meetings should include:
 - A. Mileage equivalent with the accepted levels of school systems throughout the state of Ohio.
 - B. The cost of a nights lodging at designated meetings.
- Sect. 8 Any Officer or member of the District Directors who has failed to fulfill or who has violated the purposes of this Constitution may be removed in any one of the following ways:
 - A. Two-thirds vote of the District Directors.
 - B. Two-thirds vote of all active members within his respective district.
- Sect. 9 Procedure to follow if a District Director is absent from a Meeting:
 - A. The District Director shall appoint a representative to the meeting or allow the elected district alternate to attend the meeting.
 - B. The substitute person will have the voting privileges for that district.

Sect. 10 Girls District Directors

- A. The Girls District Directors of the OHSBCA will consist of eight member coaches who are elected to three year terms.
- B. Two districts of the OHSBCA will be represented by one elected girls coach.
- C. An alternate coach will also be named. In the event that the elected member cannot serve out the entire

- term, the alternate would be elevated to that position.
- D. The Districts will be paired together as follows: Districts 1 & 4, Districts 2 & 3, Districts 5 & 12, Districts 6 & 7, Districts 8 & 9, Districts 10 & 11, Districts 13 & 14 and Districts 15 & 16.
- E. The Directors will conduct the following activities:
 - 1. Girls Player of the Year Nominations
 - 2. Girls Coach of the Year Nominations
 - 3. Girls Assistant Coach of the Year Nominations
 - 4. Academic All-Ohio Nominations
 - 5. Girls North-South All-Star Coaches 6. Girls North-South Game At-Large Selections
 - 7. Assist the Girls North-South Game Director
 - 8. Assist the Girls Showcase Director
 - Present Hall of Fame Nominees, Paul Walker Award Winner, Century Awards Winners and Bob Arnzen Awards Winners at the State Tournament
- F. The Directors will represent the social concerns and interests of Girls Basketball and will serve on committees of interest.

Article X

Event Directors / Support Personnel

- Sect. 1 The duties of the Event Directors and Support Personnel will be assigned by the President of the Association. Some of these duties for these positions will include:
 - A. Hooplines Editor/Public Relations/Historian
 - 1. Will gather, edit, and prepare materials for inclusion in the publication of *Hooplines*
 - 2. Will solicit advertising to help cover the cost of the publishing *Hooplines*
 - 3. Will be responsible for issuing to the media periodical press releases highlighting the association's projects
 - 4. Will send award winners to the OHSAA
 - 5. Take photographs of OHSBCA events
 - 6. Hooplines Issues
 - Fall Issue 1st week of October will be sent to all high school boys and girls head coaches in the State of Ohio
 - b. Constitutional / Year in Review Issue There are two separate issues. A Constitutional Issue and a Year in Review Issue. During the 1st week of December, the Constitutional Issue will be available in a limited edition, and will be posted on the OHSBCA Website. The Year in Review will be mailed to all voting members (anyone who joins prior to the Election deadline). Others may receive this issue on a request to the Hooplines Editor
 - c. Winter Issue 1st week of February will be sent to all Association Members
 - d. Spring Issue 1st week of May will be sent to all Association Members
 - e. All OHSAA Commissioners, Interested

News Media Outlets and other designated by the Executive Committee and District Directors will receive all four issues of Hooplines.

B. Showcase Directors

- 1. Secure the site to host the Showcase.
- 2. Secure the advertisement, pictures and publication of the Showcase program.
- 3. Secure coaches, officials and other personnel for the Showcase.
- 4. Proveid information about hte event of the Public Relations Director (rosters, coaches, time, site, etc.) to publicize to the new media.
- Secure the jerseys, basketballs, coaches shirts and other equipment needed for Players and Coaches.
- 6. Plan the daily events for the Showcase.
- 7. Contact college coaches and informed them of players, dates, times and sites.
- 8. Pay all expenses for the Showcase.
- 9. Provide a financial report to the Treasurer by July 1st.

C. All-Star Game Directors

- 1. Secure the site to host the All-Star Game.
- 2. Secure the advertisement, pictures and publication of the All-Star Game program.
- 3. Secure game help.
- 4. Provide information about the event to the Public Relations Director (rosters, game time, site, etc.) to publicize to the news media.
- 5. Secure uniforms, shoes, and other equipment needed for All-Star Players and Coaches.
- 6. Coordinated the activities (practices, meals, lodging, etc.) for All-Star Players and Coaches.
- Provide a financial report to the Treasurer by July 1st.
- 8. Secure the commitments for the Players of the Year for each division to participate in the Ohio North-South All-Star Games
- 9. Select and present the Most Valuable Player of the Ohio North-South All-Star Games
- D. Hall of Fame Director
 - 1. Arrange the banquet location and lodging.
 - 2. Notify past recipients of the event.
 - 3. Organize help for the event.
 - 4. Notify inductees of their selection into the Hall of Fame. Secure pictures and biographies of each recipient.
 - Provide information of the inductees to the Public Relations Director in order to send a news release of the event.
 - 6. Arrange for the event to be video taped.
 - Provide a financial report to the Treasurer by July 1st
 - 8. The cost of the banquet will be determined by the appointed chairperson and approved by the District Directors.

- 9. Update and maintain Hall of Fame Showcase
- E. Clinic Director
 - 1. Secure the site and location.
 - 2. Secure hotel accommodations.
 - 3. Arrange speakers for the event.
 - 4. Secure help for the event.
 - 5. Secure advertisers and exhibitors for the clinic.
 - 6. Develop the clinic brochure and send it to the Secretary to mail to membership.
 - 7. Send brochure to Public Relations Director to publicize the event.
 - Provide a financial report to the Treasurer by March 1st.
- F. Web Master
 - 1. Maintain the Association's web site by providing updated information.

 - 3. Email contact for the Association.

 - 5. Make annual revisions of the procedures and qualification for the awards.
 - 6. Bring recipient names to the District Directors for approval.
 - Notify the winners and retrieve pictures and biographies of winners for all Coaches Association's awards.
 - 8. Send all information on the winners to the Public Relations Director for news release.
 - Responsible for obtaining the necessary information for any honor bestowed upon any player(s) or coach(es). This includes obtaining biographical information, picture and any other necessary information.
 - 10. Responsible for informing the individuals that they are receiving an honor and when it will be presented.
- I. Monthly Newsletter
 - 1. To keep members informed of OHSBCA matters in a timely fashion.
 - 2. Newsletter will be emailed out each month to members who subscribe for service.
 - Directors in charge of emailing will request information from the Executive Committee before each newsletter is sent.
 - 4. Each newsletter will have the Rawling Logo on its letterhead.

Article XI

Boys & Girls North-South All-Star Games

- Sect. 1 The Boys and Girls North-South Games will be played on the same weekend.
- Sect. 2 The Game Directors will arrange all All-Star activities for the event.
- Sect. 3 Player of the Years must play in the North-South All-Star Game
- Sect. 4 The selection and presentation of the Most Valuable Players of each Ohio North-South All-Star Game will be done by the All-Star Game Director

- GG. Sponsors and selects players and coaches for the Boys and Girls Rising Senior Event sponsored by the National High School Basketball Coaches Association.

Article XIII

Amendments and By Laws

- Sect. 1 Any proposed amendment shall be submitted in writing to a member of the District Directors prior to any regular or called meeting of the Board.
- Sect. 2 The proposed amendments shall be read at a regular District Director's Meeting. Each proposed amendment must have two readings before approval. A two-thirds majority of District Directors present shall be necessary for the adoption of the amendment.
- Sect. 3 By-laws may be changed or added by a two-thirds vote of the District Directors.

Article XIV

Criteria and Procedures for Awards

- Sect. 1 Bob Arnzen Award
 - A. Criteria
 - 1. Coaches who have devoted 20 consecutive years or more of service to the same school at any level and must be an active member of the Association must be an active member of the association for the past five consecutive years or been an active member for 90% of the twenty coaching years.
 - B. Procedure
 - 1. Must complete the Bob Arnzen Award Form
 - 2. Must submit award form to the Awards Director
 - 3. Deadline is September 1st
 - C. Award
 - 1. The winners will receive a plaque at halftime of their respective state tournament
 - 2. The winners will be listed in *Hooplines*
 - 3. The winners will be posted on the website
 - 4. News release by Public Relations Director to all interested news media outlets
- Sect. 2 Free Throw Percentage Award Individual
 - A. Criteria
 - 1. Top 20 Individuals in Boys and Girls
 - 2. Best Free Throw Shooting Percentage wins the award
 - 3. Players must have attempted at least 60 Free Throws during the regular 22-game season.

B. Procedure

- 1. Boys Players send all stats to appointed chairperson
- 2. Girls Players send all stats to appointed chairperson
- 3. Deadline is March 1st

C. Award

- 1. The winners will be listed in *Hooplines*
- 2. Top 20 winners will receive a certificate

Sect. 3 Free Throw Percentage Award - Team

A. Criteria

- 1. Top 20 Teams in Boys and Girls
- 2. Best Free Throw Shooting Percentage wins the award

B. Procedure

- 1. Boys Players send all stats to appointed chairperson
- 2. Girls Players send all stats to appointed chairperson
- 3. Deadline is March 1st

C. Award

- 1. The winners will be listed in *Hooplines*
- News release by Public Relations Director to all interested news media outlets

Sect. 4 Two Point Field Goal Award - Individual

A. Criteria

- 1. Top 20 Individuals in Boys and Girls
- Best Two Point Shooting Percentage wins the award
